

At the culmination of a very productive and successful year, two teams from the Saint Anthony's High School Rocket Club qualified among the top 100 teams in the nation to compete in the Team America Rocketry Challenge (TARC) national finals this past May outside of Washington, DC. The contest challenges middle and high school students across the country to design and build a rocket that will climb to 800 feet and stay aloft for between 43 and 47 seconds using a parachute for a recovery device. Teams must also transport a payload of two raw eggs in their rocket and return them unbroken.

TARC is aimed at attracting students to science, math and technology education and, ultimately, careers in the aerospace industry.

This year the Rocket Club has enthusiastically grown to over 30 members. Co-founders and co-presidents Thomas Panicella '14 and John Tonna '14 have done a great job organizing the TARC teams and helping to plan aviation themed field trips to help keep members interested and motivated. Members of the Rocket Club have attended the Jones Beach Memorial Day Air Show as guests of stunt pilot Mr. David Windmiller, father of club members Matthew '13 and Robert '15. They have also visited Republic Airport where they received a brief lesson on the physics of flight as well as a tour of various aircraft.

This club, like so many other clubs and teams here at Saint Anthony's, is another great example of how dedicated and talented so many kids are. T. Timothy Ryan, Jr. is President & Chief Executive Officer of SIFMA and Director of the Global Financial Markets Association (GFMA), SIFMA's global affiliate. Mr. Ryan served as CEO of GFMA from 2009 to 2011.

Prior to joining SIFMA, Mr. Ryan was Vice Chairman, Financial Institutions and Governments, at J.P. Morgan where he was a member of the firm's

senior leadership. Mr. Ryan is a director of Lloyds Banking Group, Lloyds TSB Bank plc, HBOS plc, Bank of Scotland plc, Putnam Investments, LLC, Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company and The U.S.-Japan Foundation. He is also a private sector member of the Global Markets Advisory Committee for the National Intelligence Council (NIC). From 2002 to 2004, Mr. Ryan was a member of the US-Japan Private Sector/Government Commission

with responsibility for Corporate Restructuring and NPL workout. Mr. Ryan also served from 2000 to 2004 as a Board Member and Chairman of the Audit Committee at Koram Bank in Seoul, Korea. Prior to joining J.P. Morgan in 1993, Mr. Ryan was the Director of the Office of Thrift Supervision, U.S. Department of the Treasury. As OTS Director, Mr. Ryan was principal manager of the savings and loan cleanup which involved closing approximately 700 insolvent institutions, improving capital bases and selling over \$300 billion of assets. Mr. Ryan was a Director of the Resolution Trust Corporation and a Director of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. From 1983 to 1990, Mr. Ryan was a Partner in the Washington, D.C. office of the law firm Reed, Smith, Shaw & McClay, where he headed the Pension Investment Group and was a member of the firm's Executive Committee. From 1981 to 1983 Mr. Ryan was Solicitor of Labor, U.S. Department of Labor. Mr. Ryan is a graduate of Villanova University and American University Law School. He served as an officer in the U.S. Army from 1967 – 1970.












As a member I have learned a deeper understanding of commitment. This little group of people teaches you what it is like to work hard with others while taking what you learn those four hours a week and bringing it home to strengthen yourself. From Pippin rehearsal to Show Choir rehearsal life has never been so busy, and I wouldn't trade it for anything. I can honestly say my passion is back and I have found myself again. The musical tells the tale of Charlemagne's son, Pippin, as he searches for his place in the world. Being led from one adventure to the next by a band of players, led by a persuasive and mysterious leader (Kyle Geraghty '12), Pippin (Anthony Sarra '13) finds only

disillusion, disappointment and failure. Ultimately he finds happiness in the simple joys of being in love and having a family. The show is unique in its structure - characters often break the fourth wall and many anachronisms are sprinkled throughout the script to give the musical the feel that it is a "show within a show," and all the characters are merely traveling actors putting on another version of this production for this respective audience. The cast of twentyeight actors, singers and dancers included recent graduates Clayton Collier, Taylor Feingold, Mike Graziano as Pippin's father, stepmother and stepbrother respectively. Other highlights of the cast included Pippin's grandmother, Berthe, played by Christina Farah '13 and Pippin's love, Catherine, played by Grace O'Neill '14.




















Our Lady of China Orchestra Pilgrimage





TheNest.com (for newlyweds) and TheBump.com (for pregnant women).


ultimate resource sites, TheKnot.com (for brides),






Thomas J. Vito

Saint Anthony's scholar athletes continue to achieve great success in the classroom and on the field. Pictured are some of those students signing with the colleges or universities they will be attending.




